- 2. The 22nd DAA (San Diego County Fair) will not be responsible for loss or damage of any kind. No entry will be accepted should the exhibitor describe conditions under which they will exhibit.
- **3.** Once registered, description and title may not be changed. Review your entry before completing registration to ensure that you have entered the correct division and class for each project.
- **4.** All display decisions are the responsibility of the Program Supervisor. Work may be disqualified and not exhibited if not ready for display.
- **5.** Entries must remain on exhibit through the run of the Fair.
- **6.** Copyright: Instructor's signature on the online entry form verifies this is original student work and all necessary releases/etc. have been obtained.
- 7. Work must be in **good taste** and **suitable** for family viewing.

AWARDS

Non-Competitive Division (4000): Each participating class will receive a Classroom Participation Rosette.

Competitive Divisions (4100-4900): Each entry will receive a first, second, or third place ribbon (based on the Danish System of judging). A "Best in Class" ribbon will be awarded for the top scoring entry in each Class. A "Best of Show" ribbon will be awarded for the top scoring entry in each Division. "Best in Class" and "Best of Show" awards are selected from first place ranked entries. A Class and/or Division must have a minimum of (10) entries for awards above first place to be presented.

DELIVERY & PICK UP

Entry delivery instructions will be emailed following the entry deadline. If you are unable to bring entries on the delivery date, arrange for another person to deliver for you.

All entries must be picked up on the pick-up date – Tuesday, July 9, 2024. If you are unable to pick up on the pick-up date, arrange for another person to pick up for you.

Entries not picked up by Tuesday, July 9, 2024, will become the property of the San Diego County Fair and will be disposed of promptly.

JUDGING

Blind judging will take place virtually or on-site by qualified instructors and/or professionals. Judges will determine placings using the Danish Judging System, where each project is judged on its own merit. The decision of the judges is final. See each section and/or division for judging criteria.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PROJECTS

PRESENTATION:

Two-dimensional work may be individual, book bound, mural, or combined in a "quilt". Murals must be made of paper, canvas, or cloth - suitable for hanging.

- No frames or glass
- Individual work may not exceed 12" x18" including borders. Quilts and Murals may not exceed 8' x 8'
- Do not use glue sticks for adhesive (projects fall apart).

Three-dimensional pieces must be free-standing.



NEW THIS YEAR: VIRTUAL JUDGING DIVISIONS 4100-4900 ONLY

This year we will be judging virtually for the following departments: Drafting & Architectural Design, Fine Art, Graphics, and Photography. PLEASE FOLLOW THESE REQUIREMENTS FOR A SUCCESSFUL UPLOAD:

1. For photographic images:

- a. Acceptable photographic image formats are .jpeg, .gif, .bmp, or .png only.
- b. The total file size of the uploaded image must be 8 MB (megabytes) or less.
- c. If your total image file size is greater than 8 MB, you will need to use a photo editing program to "resize the photo image". Free programs available: Microsoft Image Resizer, Microsoft Photo Editor, Irfanview, Photoscape and others.
- d. The minimum image dimension (width or height) should be at least 450 pixels.

2. For graphic images:

- a. Acceptable graphic image format is .pdf only.
- b. The total file size of the uploaded image must be 6 MB (megabytes) or less.

3. For videos:

- a. Acceptable video formats are .mp4 or iPhone exports in .flv, .wma, or .avi.
- b. The total file size of the uploaded video must be 190 mb or less (that equates to around a minute and a half on a new iPhone).
- 4. Files not conforming to the desired formats and requirements listed above will not be allowed to upload.
- 5. A short title for your entry is required. The title cannot be greater than 30 characters.
- 6. The file name of the entry should contain the name of the entry depicted or a keyword from the name. Renaming your entry file name with at least a portion of the name of your entry makes easier identification while uploading.
 - TIP: Place your images in a folder on your computer so you can easily browse for your upload. For example, create a folder called "Fair Entries".
- 7. When you are ready to upload, the entry form will ask you to go to the folder on your computer where you prepared the images for submission. Click the file name and then click the "Upload" button on the entry form. After successfully uploading the file, a photo thumbnail will appear on the right side of the screen.
- 8. If you make a mistake, you can log back in to "My Account" and select the "Upload Media" button.

TIPS FOR PHOTOGRAPHING ART PROJECTS

- 2D artwork should be photographed with no "hot spots" or reflections (remove glass/plastic in frame).
- Sculptures should be photographed with proper lighting to show the depth, texture, and shape of the subject at the best angle.
- Avoid using a flash. Natural daylight on an overcast day, or shade on a sunny day, is the best light for photographing.
- Set camera on a tripod or solid surface for stability and aim camera level with art to avoid distortion.
- Check your camera settings to verify you are using the largest size (resolution) and highest quality (low or no compression) that your camera supports.
- Take several photos at different settings and look at them on your computer screen to select the best image.
- For photographing 3-D artwork, use a neutral-toned matte background such as grey, black, or ivory. Be sure your entry fills the frame of the photo with some, but minimal, backdrop showing.
- Digital enhancement is not permitted.

PREPARING YOUR PROJECT FOR DISPLAY

ENTRY TAGS & IDENTIFICATION LABELS - DIVISIONS 4100-4900 (Elementary School entries use the Division 4000 Entry Tag on page 4)

All projects **must** be delivered with entry tags and labels secured.

An Entry Tag must be visibly attached to each entry. After entries have been registered online, you will be prompted to print entry tags — (1) per entry. Attach entry tag to the lower right-hand corner of each entry or bottom base of free-standing entry **before** delivery to the Fair. Please print on cardstock!

An Identification Label must be attached to the back of each entry. These are used to notify students of any awards received and to identify the project in the event the tag should fall off. Use template on the next page to print/attach ID Labels. Please use the student's email address.

ENTRY TAG Print on white cardstock. Tape tag to the back of the project with the name visible from the front. Do not tape to the front of the project or attach to the front surface of your mat board. 
DRAFTING & ARCHITECTURAL DESIGN

Drafting & Architectural Design entries will be judged virtually. See Page 5 for instructions.

PRESENTATION:

Drafting entries must be printed/copied on bond no larger than D size (24" x 36"), edge bound and/or stapled on left edge. Attach Entry Tag to lower right of first page. Other entries may be rendered/mounted on appropriate paper or illustration board. Attach Entry Tag to lower right.

All entries must provide a short narrative with scope of work or programming information. For CAD projects, include the software version.



TECHNICAL PROJECTS

JUDGING CRITERIA: General Appearance, Complexity, Layout, Scale, Line Weight/Function, Accuracy and Narrative.

Class 01 TECHNICAL DRAFTING

CAD orthographic and pictorial drawings to detail and provide all information required to produce and assemble the object. Include schematic hydraulics, piping layouts, electronic circuits, etc., as applicable. Sheet metal drawings to include flat pattern layout with pictorial model.

Class 02 TECHNICAL ILLUSTRATION

CAD drawings to fully describe an object or process to the uninformed audience. Include a picture or photograph of the object illustrated.

JUDGING CRITERIA: Originality, Artistic Merit, Complexity, Layout, Composition, Shade/Shadow, Color and Narrative.

Class 01 ARCHITECTURAL DRAWINGS

Hand-drawn or CAD drawings, with dimensions, to include site plan, floor plan, elevations and typical sections of a residential or commercial building. Designs must conform to Uniform Building Code (UBC) and California Building Code (CBC).

Class 02 3-D RENDERING

Single, still, hand-drawn or CAD image representing an architectural or industrial subject. Color or black/white/grayscale. Max size is 24 x 36.

Class 03 ARCHITECTURAL / INTERIOR DESIGN STORY BOARD

Must include exterior or interior architectural drawing. May also include color renderings, inspiration photos and material samples mounted on foam core/presentation board. Max size is 32 x 40.


FASHION

PRESENTATION:

Pieces may be mounted on mannequins or hangers and should be durable enough to withstand handling by exhibit workers. Attach Entry Tag with safety pin to outside of garment.

Illustrations, textiles, and patterns must be mounted on mat board or foam core no larger than 12" x 18". Attach Entry Tag to lower right corner of presentation board.

All entries must include a write-up that explains the overall concept of the design and target market.

Class 01 FASHION ILLUSTRATION

Judging Criteria: Originality, Artistic Merit, Accurate Proportions, Design Elements & Write Up. Drawings, sketches and/or renderings of originally designed garments or footwear innovation in shape, construction, and/or materials.

Class 02 TEXTILE DESIGN

Judging Criteria: Originality, Achievement of Described Objective, Repeat Accuracy, General Appearance, and Write-Up.

Hand-drawn or CAD design including repeat dimensions, color separations and fabric type. Sample textile may be included.

Class 03 FASHION DESIGN PATTERN MAKING

Judging Criteria Complexity, Layout, Scale, Line Weight/Function, Accuracy and Narrative. Hand-drawn or CAD, 2-D or 3-D patterns with all information, including fabric type and orientation, required to cut and assemble a garment.

FINE ART

Fine Art entries will be judged virtually. See Page 5 for instructions.

PRESENTATION: Artwork must be freestanding, or hangable as described below, and be constructed to withstand handling by exhibit workers.

- Max size is 24" x 36" (2D pieces) and 36" x (3D pieces), including matting, framing, and stand.
- Canvases will be hung using Velcro tabs that will be affixed by exhibit workers no wire needed.
- Framed artwork (Plexiglass OK) must include attached wire. NO GLASS or sawtooth hangers.
- Mobiles, stained glass, masks, and other hanging 3-D artwork must be equipped with secure hanging point(s).
- Provide a stand if required for display.
- Affix entry tag to lower right for 2D pieces or as appropriate for piece; or provide a white cardstock place card (2½" x 3", when folded).

GENERAL TECHNOLOGY

GENERAL RULES:

Projects made from assembly kits are not eligible, unless otherwise stated. Component parts should be made by the exhibitor whenever reasonably possible, and judges will score accordingly. Purchased component parts other than hardware items must be identified. Projects constructed with a combination of materials should be entered in the division that most clearly represents the project's emphasis.

PRESENTATION:

- Any small parts should be mounted on a small panel to facilitate handling and showing.
- Provide stand if it required for display.
- Affix entry tag as appropriate for piece so that it is visible when project is displayed; or provide a white cardstock place card (2½" x 6", when folded).

JUDGING CRITERIA: Difficulty, Design, Construction/Finish/Craftmanship, Appearance, and Function.

Class 01 - GENERAL METAL WORK

Finished metal projects from a variety of materials such as art metal, flat stock sheet metal, and casting (mold must be student-made pattern), and processes, such as filing, sawing, riveting, forming, soldering, and bending.

Class 02 - WELDING PROCESSES/MACHINE WORK

Finished metal projects fabricated by a welding or cutting process. Machine work may include conventional or CNC/CAM lathe, mill, grinding, punching, etc.

Class 02 - WOOD CABINETRY PROJECTS

Furniture pieces that include drawers, doors, or folding mechanisms such as dressers, chests, curio cabinets, or cupboards.

Class 03 - WOOD FURNITURE PROJECTS

Furniture pieces that include legs, leaves, or folding mechanisms such as desks, tables, and chairs.

Class 04 - MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS

Wood musical instruments, including guitars, banjos, flutes, and percussion instruments.

Class 05 - UPHOLSTERED FURNITURE

Student-constructed furniture pieces or used pieces that have been upholstered or reupholstered including chairs, ottomans, sofas, and love seats.

PRESENTATION: Mount artwork to mat board or foam core of maximum size as described below. Mat board or foam core may be repurposed. Secure entry tag to bottom right corner of mat board.

Class 01 - PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISING

A printed ad promoting a social service, public service, or non-profit organization. Focus on a specific campaign for social improvement. Max size 16" x 20" including mat board.



Graphic and structural packaging programs for retail, promotional, and industrial use, including containers, bags, boxes, bottles, or labels. Max size 16" x 20" including mat board.

Class 03 - POSTERS

Entries may range from literal storytelling to metaphoric imagery or abstractions to fit the poster medium. Max size 24" x 36" including mat board (vertical orientation).

Class 04 - TYPOGRAPHY

Logos, letter marks, graphic presentations where type is used as the main graphic element in the design. Max size 16" x 20" including mat board.

Class 05 - TWO-PAGE SPREAD (Yearbook, Newspaper, or other Publication)

Two-page layout in a yearbook or newspaper that is viewed as a spread or one unit crossing the gutter. This may come out of any section of the publication. Mount on mat board 2" larger on all sides of artwork.

Class 06 - DOCUMENTS

Documents that used computer systems to assemble text and/or graphics into a final presentation. Examples: flyers, ads, brochures, pamphlets, and business cards. Mount on 16" x 20" mat board.

Class 07 - PUBLICATION LAYOUT AND DESIGN

Multi-page publications that use computer systems to assemble text and/or graphics into a final publication. Example: programs, booklets, and magazines. Publications do not need to be mounted on mat board.

Class 09 - 3D RENDERED SCENES

Any single, still digital image whose three-dimensional forms were created, shaped, colored, textured, and lit in the computer. May be architectural/industrial model or cinematic still. Max size 16" x 20" including mat board.

Class 10 - DIGITAL PAINTING & ILLUSTRATION


Assemblage, collage, or montage of images to take on new objectives or meaning for the content. Max size 16" x 20" including mat board.

Class 12 - SCREEN PRINTING

Single, spot color, or process color on any substrate including textile or garment. Max size 16" x 20".

Class 13 - PORTFOLIO

Portfolio of (6-10) two-dimensional graphic art/design pieces, in bound portfolio, or contained packaging (no electronic portfolios).





Class 02 - DIGITAL PHOTO COMPOSITE IMAGE

Digital combining of images to increase the visual impact or overall quality of the composition. Assemblage, collage, or montage of photographic images to take on new objectives or meaning, while improving or increasing the interest of the image.



ROBOTICS

PRESENTATION: Judging will take place during the Robotics Competition "Fairbotics" on June 13, 2024. Additional information will be emailed to exhibitors.

Provide notebook/binder of written records. A team member should be present to answer questions for the judges.

JUDGING CRITERIA: Innovation, Plans, Engineering, Software, Use of Materials and Fabrication Quality, Ability to Achieve Objectives, Write-Up, and Presentation.

DIVISION 4800 - ROBOTICS PROJECTS (ALL STUDENT LEVELS)

Develop a functioning robot with a power source and programmable microchip (using C, Java, Basic, etc.). Include a write-up of team members, team contributors (including professional status), total cost, hours to develop, and sponsors. Robots may be constructed of any material and be of any size. Robots may use electric, steam, solar, thermal, hydraulic, pneumatic, or any other energy source. No sharp objects allowed (drills, blades, nails, etc.).

Class 01 – ROBOTICS ENGINEERING: FABRICATED: Robots may be remote-controlled, autonomous, or both.

Class 02 - ROBOTICS ENGINEERING: NON-FABRICATED - SEMI AUTONOMOUS Class 03 - ROBOTICS ENGINEERING: NON-FABRICATED - FULLY AUTONOMOUS

SCIENCE & ENGINEERING

PRESENTATION: Submit notebook/binder of written records. Display significant details of the study on (1) 36" x 48" corrugated tri-fold presentation board. Small parts must be mounted to facilitate handling and showing. Affix (1) entry tag to presentation board & (1) entry tag to notebook.

JUDGING CRITERIA: Creativity, Demonstration of Scientific Method (Notebook), Thoroughness, and Display

DIVISION 4801 - SCIENCE & ENGINEERING PROJECTS (ALL STUDENT LEVELS) Class 01 - SCIENCE PROJECT

Develop a project demonstrating the scientific method. Every project should have a notebook and detailed written record of the scientific study. Contents should be specific and concise - Including an abstract, hypothesis (in the case of engineering and computer projects - statement of goals), procedure showing sufficient repetition of test/experiments, results, conclusions, and recommendations. Project must be designed and constructed by the student exhibitor(s).

Class 02 - ENGINEERING - ENERGY/POWER SOURCES

Develop a working model of an energy or power source, prime mover, improved system, or component. Experiment with electric, steam, solar, thermal, hydraulic, and/or pneumatic sources. Sample projects include: vehicles, solar engines, solar vehicles/boats, aero/wind tunnel experiments, and rocket designs (NO EXPLOSIVES). Include all necessary components for operation. Include purpose and operating instructions.

Class 03 - ENGINEERING - OTHER THAN ENERGY SOURCES

Develop a project demonstrating mechanical and/or electrical engineering. Include all necessary components for operation. Include purpose and operating instructions.





2024 San Diego Fair Local Rules



Presentation of completed entry form shall be deemed acceptance of all rules. Acceptance includes permission to use your name, photograph, and exhibit for the news media.

- 1. Online registration is required in all departments and some one-day contests. Online entries are accepted until 8:00pm (Pacific Time) on the deadline day for online entry registration, unless otherwise stated.
- 2. Incomplete or incorrect entry forms may be returned at the discretion of the management. The Management is not responsible for errors on entry forms which may lead to elimination or disqualification of an entry.
- **3.** Processing fees must be paid online at the time of registration.
- 4. Requests for refunds must be submitted in writing, in accordance with State Rules. Refunds under \$15 will not be granted. Badging and entry processing fees are non-refundable.
- 5. Exhibitors must be living at the time the entry form and/or online entry is submitted.
- **6.** All non-livestock entries must be the creative work of the exhibitor.
- 7. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to obtain necessary permission to use material that is considered copyrighted in their entries.
- **8.** Youth exhibitors must be **5 years** of age by January 1, 2024, and not older than 17 years on June 1, 2024, unless otherwise stated in Department Information.
- 9. The Management reserves the right to reject any exhibit/entry if it is objectionable in any way, requires an excessive amount of space, or the capacity of the department has been reached. All material used in decorating booths or exhibits must comply with State Fire codes. No entry will be accepted should the exhibitor describe conditions under which he/she will exhibit or the exhibit will be displayed.
- **10.** The Management reserves the right to limit entries, and display thereof, to facilities available and to cancel any division or class in which, in its judgment, the entries are insufficient to secure adequate competition. Classes may be closed when capacity is reached.
- 11. Substitutions may only be made in the original Division and Class, unless otherwise noted in the Department rules.
- 12. Entries must be delivered on the date(s) and times specified. Entries will not be accepted before or after the stated delivery date. All accepted exhibits must remain on display and shall not be removed until the date specified in the rules. Any exhibit not picked up on the specified date becomes the property of the San Diego County Fair and will be disposed of promptly.
- 13. All exhibits are entered and shown at the owner's risk. Reasonable care will be taken to prevent loss or damage to exhibits, but in no event will the 22nd District Agricultural Association (San Diego County Fair) be responsible for any injury or loss which may occur or for the actions of third parties. Insurance, if desired, should be obtained by the exhibitor at his/her own expense.
- **14.** The American System of Judging will be used in the Adult Divisions and the Danish System of Judging will be used in the Youth Divisions, unless otherwise stated.
- **15.** All entrants at exhibits must be neatly attired, wear shoes, and conduct themselves in a quiet and orderly manner.
- **16.** Any person who violates any Local, State, or Department rule or displays unethical conduct will forfeit all privileges and premiums and be subject to such penalty as the District may order.
- 17. Contact Information: If an entrant experiences a change of address, phone number, or email address, they are required to update this information with the Entry Office so they may be contacted regarding awards. This notification must be in writing and can be emailed to entry@sdfair.com or mailed to the Entry Department, 2260 Jimmy Durante Blvd, Del Mar, CA 92014.
- **18.** All premium money will be paid from the awards as marked by the judges in the official judging books and not from ribbons that may be attached to the exhibits. The San Diego County Fair assumes no responsibility for special awards offered by clubs, individuals, or sanctioning bodies.
- 19. All premium and auction checks will be made payable to the exhibitor as listed on the entry form or online entry. Checks will be mailed within 30 days after the close of the Fair to the address shown on the entry form. Auction checks may be held longer if the buyer has not paid. Checks not cashed within 12 months from the date of issue will be forfeited. Replacement checks may be subject to a \$35 stop payment fee.
- 20. The 22nd District Agricultural Association (San Diego County Fair) is required by the Internal Revenue Service to report any premiums paid totaling the amount of \$600 or more. Exhibitors may be required to submit a W-9 form.
- 21. The 22nd District Agricultural Association management reserves the right to amend or add to these rules, the 22nd District Agricultural Association (San Diego County Fair) assumes no liability or responsibility not herein expressed.
